History Happened Here

History Happened Here, an educational initiative, will commemorate the 250th anniversary of the United States as students (grades 5 to 12) engage in local historical research, including visits to public history sites to access key primary and secondary sources, and gain a better sense of place.

A Bundle of Silences: Reimagining Interpretive Approaches to the Past

A Bundles of Silences are seven, prerecorded webinars that pull together scholars from across the nation to explore key aspects of the American Revolution, based on RevolutionNJ's Interpretive Framework.

Each webinar has a complete lesson plan to go with it, which can be adjusted for grades 6-8 or for grades 9-12. The lesson plans are based on New Jersey Student Learning Standards, and can be used whole or worked into existing lesson plans.

A Survey of Social Studies in New Jersey Schools

As one of the first steps for RevolutionNJ, a survey on K-12 social studies education was conducted from January 2020 through June 2020. The key findings show the current state of social studies curricula in the state and offer partnership information and resources for educators.
